Second Level Session 3

Scenarios for older children to determine the ending and to act out.

Scenario 1

Imagine your mum asks you to go to Asda and buy her a loaf of bread. She tells you not to buy anything else.

When you get to Asda you see lots of different things that you would like. And you have enough money to buy something else.

Are you trustworthy? What would you do?

Act out the story and decide what happens. What do you do in Asda? Are you trustworthy? Can your mum trust you? What happens when you get home?

Scenario 2

Imagine there is a bag of sweets lying on your kitchen table. You ask your dad if you can have some. He says 'one each'.

They are sweets you love. You'd really like some more. Dad is outside in the garden. He can't see you.

Are you trustworthy? What would you do?

Act out the story and decide what happens. What do you do when your dad is outside? What happens when he comes back in? Can your dad trust you?

Scenario 3

Imagine you have a test in school. It's really hard and you're worried you've not done as well as you would have liked.

You are last out the classroom before break and you spot the test answers lying on your teachers desk. No-one else is around. You would have time to change your answers.

Are you trustworthy? What would you do?

Act out the story and decide what happens. Can your teacher trust you?

Scenario 4

Imagine you're walking home by yourself from school. Your mum has said come straight home please. It's a really sunny day and your friend says 'just come to the park with me first'. You'd love to go to the park and play football.

Are you trustworthy? What would you do?

Act out the story and decide what happens. Can your mum trust you? What happens when you get home?
